

GUIDELINE FOR EXPORT DANGEROUS GOODS CONTAINER

1. RESPONSIBILITIES OF FORWARDING AGENT/ SHIPPER/ MANUFACTURER

- i. To provide Safety Data Sheet for every product.
- ii. To engaged a competent CPC surveyor recognized by Authority for packing dangerous goods into the container.
- iii. To pack dangerous goods into the container as per the advice of the CPC surveyor.
- iv. To submit DG declaration with CPC to the Authority at least 48 hours prior vessel arrival/entering port premise.

2. RESPONSIBILITIES OF CPC SURVEYOR (COMPETENT PERSON)

- i. To obtain Safety Data Sheet prior packing dangerous goods into the container.
- ii. To ensure that the dangerous goods in the container are complied with the requirements of the International Maritime Dangerous Goods (IMDG) Code and IMO/ILO/UN ECE Guidelines For Packing of Cargo Transport Units (CTUs Code).
- iii. To witness and supervise the entire process of packing dangerous goods into the container prior signing the CPC form.
- iv. To adhere with all safety requirements during the packing of dangerous goods into the container.

3. RESPONSIBILITIES OF TERMINAL OPERATOR

- i. To ensure DG approval has been obtained from the Authority prior loading/ entering port premise.
- ii. To follow the Authority assigned/ instruction as per DG approval.
- iii. To ensure placards are affixed correctly on the container as per DG approval.
- iv. To notify the Authority immediately for any non-compliance detected.
